The Lion's Pride Award Scheme is a learning programme designed to support pupils' personal development.

Lion's Pride stands for ...

L – Life skills

I – Independence

O – Opportunities

N – New experiences and adventures

S - Success

P - Pride

R – Respectful, Ready, Safe

I - Improvement

D - Dedication

E – Environment and Community

### Adventure

# **My/Interests**

This section is intended to encourage participants to try a new hobby or pastime or to be accredited for something they are already doing. The benefits include developing a new talent as well as improving an existing one; improving self-confidence; organising their time and learning how to set and achieve goals.

For example:

- Participate in a club outside of school
- Something you do in your spare time
- Care for someone or something
- Get baking!
- Produce a piece of creative writing
- -Learn how to play a musical instrument
- Get crafty!
- Go for a walk and take photographs of nature

### Get active! Stay active!

The aim of this section is to encourage young people to get involved in a sport or physical activity. This section must be done in an addition to core PE classes.

For example:

- -Participate in a sporting event outside of school
- Collect a certificate/badge/medal for a sporting achievement
- -Participate in regular sporting activities
- -Join a sporting club in school or out
- -Complete the daily mile
- -Promote sports and encourage others to join
- Scooter/bike/walk to your destination rather than going in the car

# Me and My World

The intention of this section is to encourage young people to develop a passion for helping in their community. It is intended that they will achieve a sense of belonging and purpose in this section.

For example:

- -Support and organise a charity event within school or outside of school
- -Support a community garden
- -Build or make something to support nature in your community e.g. bird boxes, bird feeders or hedgehog house
- -Care for your environment
- -Complete an act of kindness -Participate in a community litter pick -Invite or visit a local community group for example the elderly

### Adventure

The intention of the adventure section is to encourage pupils to step out of their comfort zone and try out new challenges and outdoor activities.

For example:

- -Go on a class residential
- -Visit a new place!
- -Go on a class trip

- -Survive a camping adventure
- -Try something new
- -Climb a mountain
- -Cycle a long distance

What might this look like and what evidence will my child need?

All evidence can include the following:

- photos
- certificates
- comments from tutors or group leaders
- comments from class teachers
- comments from family members
- collectibles from events such as leaflets and ticket stubs

All activities/hours must be logged on a Lion's Pride hour sheet. All evidence must be uploaded to the Lion's Pride Award folder on GoogleClassroom (KS1 will be given login details once they have enrolled for this award). Upon successful completion of the four sections, pupils will either be awarded a bronze, silver, gold or platinum Lion's Pride Award certificate and badge or medal, which will be awarded in a special termly awards ceremony.
